Stripped back to its timber frame, the house was repaired & restored using breathable render, insulation, etc & a modern breathable limecrete floor installed (insulated to current standards) with underfloor heating, allowing an Air Source Heat Pump to be successfully used, keeping the house warm no matter the weather.



In his LEP role, Jonathan offers advice to residents throughout Uttlesford on energy efficiency improvements to their homes, especially the 3000+ trickier Listed properties in UDC.

#### Village Open Day and Open Eco Homes

On Saturday 16th March, the Littlebury Energy Project (LEP) held an Open Day in the Village Hall. Over 100 people came from around Uttlesford and from as far away as East Sussex and Tollesbury on the Essex coast. The event allowed visitors to discuss renewable energy technologies with other villagers, to visit 3 open homes around the village, and to see exhibits and get advice from local renewables vendors. Officers from UDC were also on hand to give information on grants and funding.

Organiser Chris Dodge said "The day went really well and feedback was universally positive from both attendees and exhibitors."

LEP member Charlotte Dunham expanded "It was good talking to people about improvements to their homes, and also with people involved in or setting up other energy saving groups in Essex. It felt like there was real momentum."
